#### I. PROJECT STATEMENT:

Minnesota's community forests will lose 2.65 million ash trees due to the impacts of the invasive pest emerald ash borer. Planting efforts are needed to reduce environmental and financial impacts. ENRTF funds will be used to administer up to \$300,000 in grants to local units of government for planting ecologically appropriate trees to address ash loss on public land.

#### **III. PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOMES:**

**ACTIVITY 1 Title:** Develop request for proposals, administer grants, and implement grant projects to support the planting of trees in community forests.

#### **Description:**

A request for proposals (RFP) will be issued for a grant program to provide \$300,000 in funds to communities to plant trees to mitigate the impacts of the loss of ash from emerald ash borer. The project will work with communities of different sizes and geographic locations to have the greatest impact. Participating communities will be selected based on demonstrated need for financial and technical assistance, local forestry needs, vulnerable populations (e.g., elderly, low income, etc.), readiness to take on a project of their proposed scope and size, and commitment to sustainable community forestry programming.

# Emerald Ash Borer Response Grants



There are approximately 2.65 million ash in our communities. If all ash are simply removed, Minnesota will lose billions of gallons of stormwater mitigation capacity, increasing runoff into our lakes and rivers.



#### **Economic**

\$1,198,333 in anticipated benefits (effects on stormwater, electricity, etc.)

#### Energy

1,938,166.67 conserved kilowatt hours & 132,000 conserved therms Estimated benefits of \$300,000 worth of trees planted and maintained for 25 years



#### **Stormwater**

24,281,666 gallons stormwater intercepted

#### Carbon

6,186,666 pounds of atmospheric carbon reduced
