Subject: RE: Follow up from LCCMR 4/24/23 meeting

Dear Members,

Mr. Heller just confirmed with us today that the following transcript is accurate and ok to be sent to you.

Mr. Heller spoke with LCCMR staff on 4/28/23 and shared the following concerns that can be grouped into 3 main topics:

1. The Minnesota Lottery's Annual Report
 - a. The pictures in the report are not tagged appropriately- they are tagged, but they just say "picture" instead of describing what's in the picture. This is an example of something technically being accessible but not being useable
 - b. Mr. Heller does not believe the Lottery advertises well enough the connection between the Lottery and the ENRTF and Legislature.
2. ENRTF/LCCMR funding for a full spectrum of people
 - a. Mr. Heller believes LCCMR should at least track who is applying for and who is receiving funding from ENRTF according to the following:
 - i. Economically disadvantaged
 - ii. Cultural status
 1. Pacific Islander
 2. Native/Indigenous
 3. African American
 - iii. Blind and print disabled
 - b. Mr. Heller believes LCCMR should provide outreach in different languages
3. How the Legislature is going to comply with accessibility standards by October 1, 2024 (also see the Legislative Staff Working Group [Accessibility Report to the Legislature](#))
 - a. Who is going to set criteria for what needs to be accessible vs. what receives an exemption?
 - b. Who is going to ensure that materials are not just accessible, but useable (see Lottery example above)?
 - c. Is anyone going to provide tutors for training members of the public on accessibility devices and software?
