# 3. DNR's shared professional services proposed charges to 2010 Trust Fund Projects – Jerry Hampel, Asst. Administrator, Office of Management and Budget Services (DNR)

Jerry Hampel presented an overview of the DNR's shared services group administrative charges. The purpose of DNR's shared services is to deliver operations support activities, such as facilities management, information systems, budget services, and human resources to units within the DNR.

The DNR no longer uses direct appropriations for these shared services and has opted to charge each DNR unit for the actual services used. DNR units have been told they should include these costs in requests to the LCCMR and other funding sources.

Susan Thornton informed members that staff will work with DNR staff on all the proposals where there is an assigned governance cost to clearly define what it covers and how it was calculated.

Susan Thornton informed members that she will be talking to the legislative auditor regarding the Office of the Legislative Auditor shared services report. Commissioner Gibson expressed concern about this happening with other state agencies.

#### 6. LCCMR Member Process Discussion

Greg Knopff (Senate) and Dan Mueller (Senate) discussed the breakdown of the Constitutional Dedicated Funding. Greg Knopff explained that they are projecting \$55 million available next year for the Outdoor Heritage Fund.

Commissioner Gibson asked when the Lessard-Sams Outdoor Heritage Council (L-SOHC) will be releasing their Call for Funding Requests and when is the due date. Greg Knopff said the LSOHC Call for Funding Request will be available on October 1, 2009 and will be due by November 2, 2009.

Members conversed about the 25-year plans and how the coordination between the LCCMR and LSOHC will be accomplished. Members agreed that coordination will become clear over time and communication will be important in regard to overlapping projects as an example.
