CATEGORY G - ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

MOTION: Commissioner Herman moved LCCMR ID: 186-G, "YES! (2.0) 30 Renewable Energy and Energy Conservation Projects" for \$246,000 – motion prevailed.

Members discussed that LCCMR ID: 186-G, "YES! (2.0) 30 Renewable Energy and Energy Conservation Projects" should coordinate with LCCMR ID: 177-G, "Minnesota Schools Cutting Carbon-Conserving Energy and Water" and share project findings with other Environmental Learning Centers so they can incorporate the findings into their programs.

MOTION: Commissioner Carlson moved LCCMR ID: 185-G, "UrbanWatch: Environmental Education for Urban Youth" for \$708,000 for 3 years – motion prevailed.
