A. Appropriation Language: (f) Grays Bay, Lake Minnetonka Public Water Access \$2,000,000 is from the future resources fund and \$850,000 the first year is from the trust fund to the commissioner of natural resources to acquire and develop, in cooperation with the city of Minnetonka, approximately five acres for a multi use water access site on Gray's Bay, Lake Minnetonka.

II. PROJECT SUMMARY AND RESULTS:

The DNR will acquire and develop in cooperation with the City of Minnetonka, 5.1 acres for a new public access while the City and other local partners will redevelop two existing substandard access sites into shore fishing, day use, and canoe access facilities. The property to be acquired is currently a private marina located on the eastern most bay of the lake.

The plan for the new public access includes

- 112 car trailer parking spaces
- 20 car only spaces
- 3 launch ramps
- Access walkways to shorefishing
- Landscaping

The project will improve service to boaters, lessen impact on the environment, and create additional access to the lake for the general public by replacing a private marina and consolidating low quality public access from two substandard access sites.

Development of the new access is part of a larger initiative which the local partners will complete:

- Redevelopment of two substandard accesses, on the Grays Bay Causeway and at the dam controlling the outlet of the lake into Minnehaha Creek.
- Both will be converted into public use areas providing shore fishing, lake viewing, picnicking, and canoe access to Minnehaha Creek.
- Assistance in developing the new access on the 5.1 acre parcel including city funding of twenty-eight boat slips and gas dock.
