Appropriation Language: 4,850,000 (Env. Trust Fund) Restoring Minnesota's Fish and Wildlife Habitat Corridors Phase II - \$2,425,000,000 the first year and \$2,425,000 the second year are from the trust fund to the commissioner of natural resources for the second biennium for acceleration of agency programs and cooperative agreements with Minnesota Deer Hunters Association, Ducks Unlimited, Inc., National Wild Turkey Federation, Pheasants Forever, The Nature Conservancy, Minnesota Land Trust, the Trust for Public Land, Minnesota Valley Trust, Inc., U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Bureau of Indian Affairs, Red Lake Band of Chippewa, Leech Lake Band of Chippewa, Fond du Lac Band of Chippewa, USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service, and the Board of Water and Soil Resources to plan, restore, and acquire fragmented landscape corridors that connect areas of quality habitat to sustain fish, wildlife, and plants. As part of the required work program, criteria and priorities for planned acquisition and restoration activities must be submitted to the legislative commission on Minnesota resources for review and approval before expenditure. Expenditures are limited to the 11 project areas as defined in the work program. Land acquired with this appropriation must be sufficiently improved to meet at least minimum habitat and facility management standards as determined by the commissioner of natural resources. This appropriation my not be used for the purchase of residential structures unless expressly approved in the work program. Any land acquired in fee title by the commissioner of natural resources with money from this appropriation must be designated: (1) as an outdoor recreation unit under Minnesota Statutes, section 86A.07; or (2) as provided in Minnesota Statutes, sections 89.018, subdivision 2, paragraph (a); 97A.101; 97A.125; 97C.001; and 97C.011. The commissioner may so designate any lands acquired in less than fee title. The appropriation is

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available until June 30, 2006, at which time the project must be completed and final products delivered, unless an earlier date is specified in the work program.

II. and III FINAL PROJECT SUMMARY:

This project resulted in a grand total of approximately 432 acres and/or 4 miles of lake and stream shoreline being acquired as either easement or fee title. Environmental and Natural Resources Trust dollars directly acquired approximately 90 acres of the total, including 1 mile of lake and stream shoreline. Outside funds (\$837,000) and other state monies (\$1,828,628) leveraged with trust dollars totaled approximately \$2,665,628. These contributions helped acquire the remaining acres of the grand total, including 220 acres and 2 miles using state dollars and 122 acres and 1 mile from other outside funds. This project complemented parcel acquisitions funded in the past with capital bonding, Trout Stamp, and Environmental Trust Fund dollars. The acquisition of aquatic management areas adjacent to lakes and streams ensured the protection of critical riparian habitat areas within sensitive watersheds and headwater areas, as well as, angler and management access. Acquisition under this segment concentrated in the following project areas: 2. Upper Mississippi Headwaters, 3. Border Prairie, 4. Central Lakes, and 11. Mississippi Blufflands.

IV. Final Outline of Project Results:

Result 1: Land Acquisition

Allocation \$600,000

Balance \$0

The acquisition of aquatic management areas adjacent to lakes and streams will ensure the protection of critical riparian habitat, angler access, and management access. The monies will be used to secure fee title or easements on approximately 27 acres and or 6 miles of lakeshore and/or stream shoreline including sensitive watershed, riparian, or headwaters areas. These lands will be used for angler access or protection of critical habitats. Spending of trust monies and parcel information will be reported as it occurs under each result.

VI. PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE SPENDING

A. Past Spending:

The Division of Fisheries annually spends about \$30,000 to \$100,000 in fishing license and trout and salmon stamp dollars for this activity, mainly for salaries of permanent staff that manage the acquisition process.

Funding for fisheries acquisition since 1994 has been as follows:

B. Current and Future Spending:

The long-range fisheries acquisition goal is to acquire approximately 1,200 miles of lake and stream shoreline by fee title or easement. The Division of Fisheries is and will continue to cover the salaries of permanent staff that manage the acquisition process. In FY 2003, Fisheries will be using up the balance of funds from Phase I of the Wildlife Corridors Project. The Division of Fisheries will utilize monies from the Trout Stamp fund (\$200,000) and Heritage Funds (\$500,000) to acquire parcels and easements statewide. The Division will continue to maintain parcels acquired and cover salaries of permanent staff that manage these parcels.

C. Project Partners:

Partners Receiving LCMR Funds: See attached overall spreadsheet Habitat Corridors Partners are worked with whenever possible.

Project Cooperators:

Southeast Minnesota Trout Stream Advisory Group is comprised of the following affiliations: Trout Unlimited, Minnesota Trout Association, local business owners, and local landowners. In-kind support and fund raising to match monies up to 5% of projects being done on trout streams with emphasis in the southeast.

VII. Dissemination

Land acquired for angler access and habitat protection will be posted. Partnership will distribute accomplishments through various avenues as established by the media and data/mapping subcommittees.

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VIII. Location

Within the established corridors, we will target areas that provided angler access and unique or important habitats such as aquatic plant beds, fish spawning areas, sensitive riparian areas, and undeveloped lake and stream shores. Emphasis will also be placed on southeast trout streams that have support from the Southeast Minnesota Trout Stream Advisory Group.

IX. Reporting requirements

Periodic work program progress reports will be submitted not later than November 30, 2003; March 30, 2004; November 30, 2004; March 30, 2005; and November 30, 2005 to LCMR. A final work program report and associated products will be submitted by June 30, 2006.


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Shoreline acquisition
