Project Name: Beaver Creek WMA
Project Area: 9 - Des Moines River Valley

Description: This project is adjacent to the North unit of the Beaver Creek WMA and is progess toward joining it to the

south which would protect over 3 miles of the river corridor. It is located just 1 mile S of Lake Shetek and within the identified MN Habitat Conservation Partnership Project Area 9. The project provides excellent deer and turkey habitat (84.26 wooded pastureland exists) and with grassland restorations (33.74 acres tillable to be restored), will provide fair pheasant habitat given the associated uplands on adjacent projects.

The funding package was put together in partnership with the landowner (donated fee value), Pheasants Forever, Natioal Wild Turkey Federation, and the Minnesota DNR. Final closing on this property will occur on or before October 15, 2008.



NWTF Phase III Habitat Conservation Partnership - Project Location Explanation

In requesting the 2005 appropriation it was the partnerships intent to provide a corridor map that includes the high priority areas of Minnesota. These high priority areas were defined by habitat quality/land form and existing density of public habitat ownership. This project is in the Prairie Coteau, which is an elevated prairie about 200 miles long and 100 miles wide, rising from the prairie flatlands in eastern South Dakota and extending southwesterly through Minnesota and into Northwestern Iowa. Oddly, the 2005 map omitted the portion of the coteau in Lincoln, Lyon and Murray counties plus a small piece in Northwest Cottonwood County. The habitat quality of the land form in the omitted area is the same as that in the mapped corridor. The density of public habitat ownership in the omitted area does not differ significantly from that in the included area. In 2007, the HCP realized that the northwestern extent of the coteau should be included in the corridors and extended the map accordingly.

The 2005 map contained a mistake and Beaver Creek WMA is a valuable contribution to the deliverables the legislature intended to receive from the appropriation. It enhanced the density of quality habitat in a priority area in Minnesota. Furthermore, any other potential seller in the omitted area would have been assumed by most to be in the 2005 prairie coteau corridor and would have been treated the same way as the seller of the land now known as Beaver Creek WMA.
