I. PROJECT TITLE: HCP Phase VI Supplemental – Fish Habitat Improvement

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Location: All fish habitat improvement work will be completed within the nine project area boundaries identified in the attached map (please see the 1a Project Area Coordination and Mapping work plan).

Total Trust Fund Project Budget: Trust Fund Appropriation \$ 100,000

Appropriation Language:

\$1,344,000 is added to Laws 2009, chapter 143, section 2, subdivision 4, paragraph (e), from the trust fund for the acceleration of agency programs and cooperative agreements. Of this appropriation, \$308,000 is to the commissioner of natural resources for agency programs and \$1,036,000 is for agreements as follows: \$425,000 with Ducks Unlimited, Inc.; \$50,000 with National Wild Turkey Federation; \$164,000 with the Nature Conservancy; \$102,000 with Minnesota Land Trust; \$200,000 with the Trust for Public Land; \$45,000 with Friends of Detroit Lakes Wetland Management District; and \$50,000 to the Leech Lake Band of Ojibwe to plan, restore, and acquire fragmented landscape corridors that connect areas of quality habitat to sustain fish, wildlife, and plants. The United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service is an authorized cooperating partner in the appropriation. Expenditures are limited to the project corridor areas as defined in the work program. Land acquired with this appropriation must be sufficiently improved to meet at least minimum habitat and facility management standards as determined by the commissioner of natural resources. This appropriation may not be used for the purchase of residential structures, unless

expressly approved in the work program. All conservation easements must be perpetual and have a natural resource management plan. Any land acquired in fee title by the commissioner of natural resources with money from this appropriation must be designated as an outdoor recreation unit under Minnesota Statutes, section 86A.07. The commissioner may similarly designate any lands acquired in less than fee title. A list of proposed restorations and fee title and easement acquisitions must be provided as part of the required work program. All funding for conservation easements must include a long-term stewardship plan and funding for monitoring and enforcing the agreement.

II. PROJECT SUMMARY AND RESULTS: This project will work on an estimated 13 acres and/ or 0.5 miles of critical shoreland and/or aquatic habitat. Priority will be given to restoring regionally significant fish and wildlife habitat.

IV. OUTLINE OF PROJECT RESULTS: This project will focus on habitat linkages that endeavor to improve fish habitat and protect water quality on streams and lakes. Examples of projects include stream channel restorations, beaver control, installation of aeration systems, spawning area development, dam modifications, bank stabilization, and fish barrier projects that occur adjacent to or in lakes and streams

Result 1: Fish Habitat Improvement

Description: Project money will be used to work on up to 13 acres and/ or 0.5 miles of critical habitat. Funds will be used to pay for professional services as needed, such as the costs of fleet, signage, design work, engineering and surveys. A portion of the funds will also be used to pay for experienced temporary staff that is seasonally called back to service when a project is available for them to do. If called back they would either do the work on approved projects or oversee that work. These crews will only be used when they are the best value and quality than contracting with an outside vendor or when no outside vendors have the expertise to do that type of work. Some funds may need to be used to pay for attorney fees to review contracts and deeds to ensure that easement language and boundaries are confirmed and to pay for Department of Natural Resources engineering services. Contracts for habitat work installation or materials will be done through the standard state procedures.
