## **Appropriation Language:**

\$160,000 is from the trust fund to the commissioner of natural resources to hold teacher training workshops on the use of digital photography as a tool for learning about nature. The equipment must be provided from other funds.

## **II. PROJECT SUMMARY AND RESULTS:**

"Connecting Youth with Nature" addresses the problem that young people are losing interest in nature, and that their involvement in outdoor recreation is declining. This project responds to the need for outdoor-based curricula identified by the Outdoor Education Working Group in January 2009. It will allow children to experience positive photography experiences in the outdoors through planning and presenting 80 digital photography training workshops for 1000 elementary and middle school teachers, park naturalists, and nature center naturalists.

Two coordinators would train and supervise nine workshop facilitators who have a background in nature, digital nature photography, and teaching. These coordinators and facilitators would plan and carry out teacher workshops on how to use digital photography in the outdoors to enhance traditional classroom curricula. Teachers would receive continuing education units (CEUs) and be provided with curriculum guides and free loan of learning trunks with cameras and field guides.

Teachers would return to their classroom, state park, or nature center and carry out digital photo safaris with their students. These activities would meet state academic standards as they relate to science, art, language arts, and math. The photo safari sessions would involve the use of volunteers who would serve as mentors.

The goal of this project is to reach at least 1000 teachers and naturalists with nature photography outdoor workshops over a two-year period. It is estimated that they will introduce 30,000 students to the opportunities for discovering Minnesota's outdoors through digital photography.

#### IV. OUTLINE OF PROJECT RESULTS:

**RESULT/ACTIVITY 1:** 80 Digital Photography Bridge to Nature teacher workshops

**Description:** Eighty "Connecting Youth with Nature" workshops will be held for 1000 teachers and naturalists during the biennium. A total of 42 photography learning trunks will be created that include teacher curriculum materials, wildlife field guides, and 12 digital cameras each. The cameras will be obtained from other funding sources. Teachers will subsequently be able to check out these photography learning trunks for use by students for photo safaris in natural areas, wildlife lands, and parks near their schools. Some camera trunks will be maintained in DNR State Parks. The resulting photos will be used to enhance curriculum studies in math, science, geography, arts, and language arts.

#### **VI. PROJECT STRATEGY:**

**A. Project Partners:** DNR Divisions of Ecological Resources, State Parks and Trails, Fisheries, and Enforcement; Master Naturalists' Program, MN Pollution Control Agency; Watchable Wildlife Inc.; MN Nature Photography Club; MN Extension Service; Minnesota 4-H, White Earth Indian Band; National Camera Exchange, Brandenburg Foundation, USFWS National Wildlife Refuges; and Lee and Rose Warner Nature Center.

**B. Project Impact and Long-term Strategy:** It is the goal of this project to reach 1000 teachers and naturalists in the first two years. These teachers should consequently reach 30,000 students with the opportunity to explore Minnesota's outdoors with a camera and use their nature photos to enhance their learning experiences. It is the long term intention to carry this project forward for at least the next six years to institutionalize this strategy into Minnesota's school curricula.
