I. PROJECT STATEMENT: To provide funds to the City of Harmony so that they can purchase the fee title interest in the entire land corridor needed to develop an extension of its state trail (Harmony is calling this extension the "Harmony Stateline" State Trail), which is a legislatively authorized state trail that will extend the Harmony-Preston State Trail south from Harmony to the Iowa/Minnesota border, with a spur to Niagara Cave. This 6 mile trail is the first step in a proposed SE Minnesota- NE Iowa interstate trail system which will connect the Root River Trail system with the NE Iowa Trail system.

III. PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOMES:

ACTIVITY 1: Land Acquisition

Description: Option contracts are in place and give the City of Harmony exclusive right to purchase the entire trail corridor, but the options expire December 31, 2019. The City of Harmony will utilize its experienced staff to facilitate all the technical aspects of the project and transactions, including but not limited to surveying and appraisals.

VII. LONG-TERM- IMPLEMENTATION AND FUNDING:

The City of Harmony will utilize ENRTF funds to acquire fee title interest in the described parcels in order to secure the proposed trail route discussed in this work plan. Once purchased, the City will donate the land to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The DNR has acknowledged willingness to accept this donation. The ultimate goal is to construct a trail in this corridor, but construction is not a part of this request. Funding for construction of the trail is proposed through bonding legislation (HF 161 & SF 67). The finished trail would be owned and maintained by the DNR.

VIII. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:

- The project is for 1 year, will begin on 7/1/18, and end on 6/30/19.
- Periodic project status update reports will be submitted January 31 and June 30 of each year.
- A final report and associated products will be submitted between June 30 and August 15, 2019.





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






"Harmony Stateline" **State Trail Extension**

Fee Title Acquisition

 - a. The Harmony Trail Commission worked with land owners over a 30-year period to identify portions of parcels that formed a contiguous trail corridor that could connect the City of Harmony to the Iowa state line with a spur to Niagara Cave. These trail parcels were identified and discussed with input and support from landowners. No eminent domain was used nor was it ever discussed as an option.

Generally, the area needed for this trail corridor follows paths that would be considered marginally productive/scrub land. The route was designed to allow trail users to enjoy the scenic beauty rural Fillmore County while being unobtrusive to residential or other activities on surrounding parcels. Parcels/the route was chosen because it minimizes need for private property while still connecting the points needed, the Harmony Trail Commission also worked with the DNR to identify and avoid parcels that contained environmentally sensitive features. This route is preferable because it does not require any bridges.

WHEREAS, Fillmore County is home to the Root River State Trail (RRST), which serves to provide recreational opportunities for resident and nonresident bicyclists, skiers, hikers, and other recreationalists year-round.

WHEREAS, the RRST and the activity it generates provides additional economic opportunities for local businesses.

WHEREAS, the RRST provides an opportunity for exercise and healthful living for local residents.

WHEREAS, the City of Harmony is undertaking efforts to extend the bike trail from the City of Harmony to the Iowa Border.

WHEREAS, the Cresco Trail system in Iowa is interested in connecting to the RRST by bringing their trail to the Minnesota border to meet the proposed RRST extension.

WHEREAS, connecting the RRST to the Iowa trail system may provide additional economic activity and opportunity in Fillmore County.

WHEREAS, trail advocates envision a Northeast Iowa/Southeast Minnesota trail loop and extension of the trail from Harmony to the Iowa border is the first step in achieving that vision.

WHEREAS, extending the RRST to the Iowa border will permit trail users convenient access to Niagara Cave, one of Fillmore County's premier tourist destinations and proposed National Landmark.
