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PROJECT STATEMENT:

Our request is for additional funding to complete the building of the Mesabi Trail from **McKinley to Biwabik**. This segment is a key piece of the Mesabi Trial that connects major portions of the trail already constructed. This 5.5 miles long trail received year 2017 LCCMR funding in the amount of \$753,000 of which there is a balance of \$583,065,and Federal TAP funding in the amount of \$1,004,976; and Legacy funds of \$179,763; and we are requesting an additional \$1,000,000 to build this trail for a construction cost of \$2,628,000. The trail has been rerouted around the shore of a lake which will require construction of 900 feet of floating bridge and additional wetland mitigation which has increased the construction costs. This segment also has a large amount of fencing which is required by the adjoining mining and mineral concerns which has added to the costs. Identifying and securing easements and right of ways in this segment has been complicated due to expanding mining operations, wetlands, and private ownerships.

The original work plan from August 2019 included a segment of the trail from the Darwin Meyers WMA to CR 21. This segment has been removed from the work plan because, the Regional Railroad Authority applied for and has received a grant from the IRRRB for the funding needed to complete this segment.

The St. Louis and Lake Counties Regional Railroad Authority has increased staffing in accounting and administration to accommodate the reporting and financial management of the grants received from various agencies. This staffing includes a part time accounting person dedicated from the St. Louis County Purchasing Department and a full time employee at the Regional Railroad Authority to assist in all administrative duties.

III. PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOMES:

ACTIVITY 1 Title: McKinley to Biwabik

Description: This 5.5 miles long trail will make connections to the existing Mesabi Trail in the City of McKinley and in the City of Biwabik. Do to right-of-way issues, part of the proposed trail has been relocated to a new location where seen on the attached maps. The new trail location length is approximately 3,900 feet passing across the Cave Lake water inlet and adjoining wetlands. We are proposing to construct a 900 feet long floating bridge to cross the wetlands minimizing impacts to the wetland and water flowage. The new trail location has increased project costs primarily for the floating bridge and wetland mitigation and fencing along the trail in areas of mining operations.

Environmental work and engineering design will need to be performed on the new trail. The right-of-way has been acquired.

VII. LONG-TERM- IMPLEMENTATION AND FUNDING:

Long-term strategy for the Mesabi Trail has not changed since 1995 which is to construct a trail from Grand Rapids to Ely connecting 26 communities along the way. Seeking eligible grants to complete the trail is an ongoing process. A key component is to maintain the completed trail to last for a period greater than 20 years. The Regional Railroad Authority has committed to maintain the trail and currently budgets over \$300,000 per year for maintenance costs.

Short-term impacts make local trails connections between communities and destinations.




