MAIN PROPOSAL

PROJECT TITLE: Conserving Priority Lands and Shorelands in Cass County

I. PROJECT STATEMENT

Cass County has over 500 high quality lakes, many deep water lakes; hundreds of miles of streams, including the headwaters of the Mississippi river; pristine and undisturbed forests (private, county, state, federal, and tribal owned and managed); hundreds of thousands of acres of original wetlands; abundant recreational opportunities including trails, hunting, and fishing; half of Minnesota's naturally reproducing Muskie lakes; and ranks high for rare plants and high priority wildlife species of greatest concern. These resources have high ecological value to Minnesotans for recreation and continuation of our state's legacy of pristine resources, and they are the cornerstone of Cass County's economic stability. With steady population growth in Cass County (28% between 1990 and 2000 and up to 50% additional growth projected by 2030) the future quality of these natural resources is threatened by shoreland development and forest fragmentation that can lead to increased nutrient loading impacting water quality, degradation of fish and wildlife habitat, and destruction of rare and endangered plants and species. Conservation of priority undeveloped shorelands and vulnerable forest lands will provide permanent protection for these highest and most sensitive natural resources in Cass County.

This project will provide financial incentives and technical assistance to private landowners who are willing to <u>donate</u> conservation easements on priority shorelands and/or sensitive forestlands for permanent protection against future development (Priority A3). Using permanent conservation easements is a long term strategy to protect recreational opportunities, water quality, and critical land and aquatic habitats that is consistent with the identification of ecologically sensitive lands and recommendations in the Statewide Conservation and Preservation Plan (pages 25-92).

II. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT RESULTS

Result 1: Protection of 3,000 land acres, including 12 miles of priority shorelands, through the donation of 30 conservation easements from private landowners.

Budget: \$511,500

A recent mapping project by the Leech Lake Area Watershed Foundation and Cass County Environmental Services identified that 38% of Cass County's shorelands are undeveloped and have high conservation potential. These shorelands plus sensitive shorelands identified by the Minnesota DNR's Pilot Sensitive Shoreland Project in Cass County will be targeted for donated conservation easements. Landowners will be educated about opportunities and benefits of easements with workshops and publications. Lake Association Land Conservation Committees, formed to identify conservation opportunities on their lake and work with local landowners, will receive training on "how to talk to landowners about conservation options" and trained on the application of the DNR's Sensitive Shoreland model to identify high priority shorelands. Conservation specialists will also be available to provide easement consultation to interested landowners.

Once the landowner is ready to donate an easement, financial incentives will be provided through payment of the closing costs associated with easements (appraisals, legal and financial advice, title work, professional review of easement documents, stewardship fees for the Minnesota Land Trust, and other unique closing costs that may arise). The easements will be held by a qualified entity, either governmental (Cass County) or nonprofit (Minnesota Land Trust or others) appropriate to the landowners conservation goals. Cass County Environmental Services Department has proven the cost effectiveness of this approach through a pilot project funded by the Board of Water and Soil Resources. With \$85,000 for incentives, private landowners donated conservation easements on 557 acres and 11,500 feet of shoreline worth \$5.7 million that averaged out to \$7.39 per foot of shoreline for permanent protection. This cost of permanent protect is much cheaper than acquisition or restoration of impaired water quality for permanent resource protection.

III. PROJECT STRATEGY AND TIMELINE

A. Project Partners

- Leech Lake Area Watershed Foundation (LLAWF): LLAWF facilitates the formation of and supports lake association Land Conservation Committees, called Sustainability Committees, with training, educational materials on conservation options, and technical assistance in identifying high priority land parcels for conservation easements and other conservation options. LLAWF will be responsible for the delivery of two workshops for Lake Association Land Conservation Committees and two public information meetings on conservation options, plus the development of fact sheets and a primer on conservation options for landowners.
- Minnesota Land Trust (MLT): Qualified holder of conservation easements; they will provide easement consultation and technical review of easement documents.

B. Project Impact

The impact of this project will ultimately be protection of some of Minnesota's most pristine, and ecologically sensitive, natural resources located in Cass County and it will insure that while the County population continues to grow and prosper, a legacy of quality natural resources and ample recreational opportunities for many Minnesotans will be maintained for future generations to enjoy.

C. Time

Funding is requested for three years primarily because it takes considerable time to bring an easement from initial landowner interest to final completion.

D. Long-Term Strategy (if applicable)

Using permanent conservation easements is a long-term strategy for water quality and habitat protection identified in the Statewide Conservation and Preservation Plan. The easements placed through this project will serve as a model and incentive for additional landowners to follow with similar land protections. This projects also meets the objectives of the Minnesota Forest Resources Council's *Recommended Desired Outcomes, Goals and Strategies for the North Central Landscape Region Report,* January 27, 2004, that identifies fragmentation of landscapes from increasing development as a major resource concern in the North Central Region. The plan recommends the use of conservation easements to meet goals for minimizing the loss of forestland (riparian and non riparian) and protecting sensitive and/or undeveloped shorelines. The plan further promotes educating lakeshore owners and lake associations on the environmental benefits of natural shorelines and providing cost share programs to improve and protect shorelines.
