MAIN PROPOSAL

PROJECT TITLE: CapX2020 Routing: Blufflands & Mississippi River

I. PROJECT STATEMENT

WHY Currently the CapX2020 high voltage power line project has been approved by the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission which has granted the "Certificate of Need" assuring the project's construction. The massive high voltage lines and towers will be crossing the entire state of Minnesota with the final leg going from Rochester, through the scenic and biologically sensitive Blufflands region, crossing the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge, and terminating in La Crosse, Wisconsin. Being the largest power line ever to be constructed in the history of the state, it is posing numerous environmental & visual threats to the fragile Blufflands landscape and the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge.

The next step of the CapX2020 project is the Routing Process that involves mapping resources, identifying opportunities and constraints within the project study area, and evaluating each alternative. There will be a series of public hearings to get input from residents, landowners, local and tribal governments, business groups, state agencies, and other stakeholders. As a result of these hearings the final routing will be established.

GOALS The goal of the project is to ensure that the final routing, the specific siting, and the methods of construction will protect the environmental, cultural, and visual aspects of the Blufflands landscape and the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge to the highest degree possible.

HOW This project will provide extensive high quality oblique aerial, ground, and water level photography to document, in detail, the various proposed routes and the specific landscapes and waterscapes along the proposed corridors of the Blufflands and Mississippi River project area. Photographic images will be identified, cataloged and accurately located on a series of maps at varying scales. Select photographs will be digitally modified to illustrate representative images of the power lines and towers upon the landscapes and waterscapes. Electronic and printed copies of the photographs and maps will be made available and presented to residents, landowners, local and tribal governments, business groups, state agencies, the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission and other stakeholders so as to provide an informative and realistic knowledge base to help evaluate and communicate with the planners of the CapX2020 project, and to assist in identifying and assuring the least damaging routing and construction alternatives.

Project Team/Partners

Robert Hurt, the Project Manager and principal of Robert J. Hurt Landscape Photography, has a strong background in photography, conservation land planning and architecture. His photography centers on ground, water, and oblique aerial work, and his client base is primarily organizations working on conservation issues such as U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Minnesota DNR, Audubon Minnesota & National Audubon, The Nature Conservancy, Trust for Public Lands, Conservation Fund, etc. His photography assignments have focused on the Upper Mississippi River and the Blufflands landscape of Minnesota, Wisconsin and Iowa. His conservation land planning work is highlighted by the 1995 / 1998 LCCMR funded Winona County/La Crescent Area Common Vision project which dealt with growth management and environmental issues in the heart of the Blufflands landscape. James Rozovics has a strong background in architecture and photography and was principal of a 12 person Chicago based architectural firm. In addition, he was involved with Smart Growth planning for the community of Prairie du Sac which is located in the Wisconsin Blufflands. Robert Hurt and James Rozovics have collaborated on a number of architectural and planning projects throughout their careers. Currently, both are living in the Minnesota Blufflands near La Crescent, Minnesota and the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge. Robert Hurt will be the Project Manager and will be doing aerial, ground and water level photography. James Rozovics will be doing, ground and water level photography. Both will participate in all other tasks. Throughout the project they will be working closely with the Minnesota DNR, U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and other agencies and stakeholders.

B. Timeline Requirements

The Timeline Requirements are tied into the CapX2020 planning and construction timeline as well as the spring / summer / fall photography window. The portion of the high voltage power line that will be going through the Blufflands region and crossing the Mississippi River will be the last segment to have public hearings and final approval. However, due to the best time to do the photography, we would be starting immediately on July 1, 2010 and proceeding along at a fairly rapid pace as shown in the Description of Project Results.


