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MAIN PROPOSAL

PROJECT TITLE: Hok-Si-La Park Trail Extension

I. PROJECT STATEMENT

The extension of the River Walk trail into Hok-Si-La Park is necessary to improve access to the park. The park is an important asset for the community, since it is a primitive park, and contains several unique natural habitats. Unfortunately, it is underutilized and separated from the community. Improving access through a new trail would make it more available to community members and visitors. The trail extension would also be a step towards Lake City becoming part of the larger regional trail network in Southeast Minnesota.

The project will extend the River Walk along the T.H. 61 right-of-way (ROW), across Gilbert Creek, up to the existing paved entrance to the park.

The goal for this project is to extend the River Walk trail into Hok-Si-La Park, and then continue to develop the trail system outlined in the 2001 Lake City Comprehensive Plan. Eventually, Lake City will be able to develop a connection between existing trails to the south and north.
