#### PROJECT TITLE: Acquisition of School Trust Lands through Eminent Domain

#### I. PROJECT STATEMENT

There exists in Minnesota law a fundamental conflict of interest in the State's conservation of Peatland Scientific and Natural Areas on lands designated as school trust fund land. The statutorily created Peatland Scientific and Natural Areas (Minnesota Statutes, sections 84.035-.036) preclude the Department of Natural Resources' ability to perform its fiduciary responsibility to generate an economic return through peat mining, mineral extraction, timber harvesting and installation of drainage ditches. Yet, Article XI, section 8 of the Minnesota Constitution created a system to provide a long-term funding source for public schools. Furthermore, Minnesota Statutes, section 84.027 subd. 18 and section 127A.31 codify the intent for the Department of Natural Resources to manage school trust lands to secure the maximum long-term economic return for the permanent school trust fund.

The goal of this project is to acquire approximately a substantial portion of school trust lands managed by the DNR within the statutorily created Myrtle Lake Peatland Scientific and Natural Area. DNR estimates that it can acquire approximately 7,500 to 10,000 acres of the 20,000 acres school trust lands within Myrtle Lake Peatland SNA. In order to preserve the public use and provide income to the permanent school trust fund, the State must exercise its eminent domain powers to acquire the school trust lands as the Constitution mandates that school trust lands be sold only at public auction. The eminent domain action will perfect the established public use as a Peatland Scientific and Natural Area. The project, therefore, will conserve the Myrtle Lake Peatland Scientific and Natural Area as a unique natural resource in Minnesota while fulfilling the fiduciary responsibility to generate revenue from school trust lands.

## **II. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT ACTIVITIES**

## Activity 1: Identification of school trust lands within Peatland SNA's.

#### Budget: \$15,000

DNR has identified approximately 50,000 acres of school trust lands within the statutorily created Peatland SNA boundaries. DNR staff will utilize existing land record databases and GIS to identify, map, and categorize and prioritize all school trust lands within Peatland SNA boundaries.

#### Activity 3: Determination of Value for Public Use

The State must determine the market value of the school trust lands within the Peatland SNA boundaries in order to compensate the Permanent School Trust Fund. An independent third party appraiser and appraisal reviewer will be hired to determine market value. Attorney General's office will present valuations to appointed Court Commissioners for determination of fair compensation.

## **III. PROJECT STRATEGY**

## A. Project Team/Partners

Project staff in the Division of Lands & Minerals will be responsible for overall project coordination, and all of Activity 1 and a portion of Activity 3. The Attorney General's office will be responsible for Activity 2 and 4, and a portion of Activity 3.

## **B.** Timeline Requirements

Funding for one and one-half years (July 1, 2013 through December 31, 2014) is requested to initiate and complete the eminent domain action. The basis stems from the intricacies to identify and recommend a prioritization of parcels for acquisition, and commencing and concluding an eminent domain action in Minnesota district court.

## C. Long-Term Strategy and Future Funding Needs

DNR has identified approximately 50,000 acres of school trust lands managed within the Peatland SNA program. DNR's long-term strategy is to acquire all 50,000 acres identified over a five year period. DNR's initial conservative assessment is that the requested funding amount will permit the State to acquire 10,000 acres within the Myrtle Lake Peatland SNA. The DNR long-term strategy will be to acquire the remaining 40,000 acres over a period of five successive years at a cost of approximately \$20,000,000.

In addition to the statutorily created Peatland Scientific and Natural Areas, DNR administers school trust acreages within three other non-income generating management units. They are: old growth forest designations (approximately 20,000 acres); water access sites (119 sites); and wildlife management areas (approximately 2,400 acres). A conservative estimate to acquire these school trust lands through eminent domain is \$45,000,000. Assuming appropriations are allotted for these acquisitions, DNR envisions completing these over a five year period after completion of the SNA acquisitions.


