#### PROJECT TITLE: Metropolitan Regional Park System Land Acquisition—Phase 4

#### I. REVISED PROJECT STATEMENT

\$2.17 million of ENRTF funds matched with \$2.65 million Metropolitan Council bonds/local government funds will acquire 374 acres of high quality natural resource lands for the Metropolitan Regional Park System.

Acquisition of these lands preserves open space for wildlife habitat and provides numerous outdoor recreational opportunities. The parcels include lake/river/stream shoreline, forests, and wetlands.

This proposal would be the fourth phase of ENRTF funding to help acquire 13,500 acres of high-quality natural resource lands as part of the Metropolitan Regional Park System. Acquisition protects these resources and helps meet the outdoor recreation needs of an expanding population in the seven-county Twin Cities Metropolitan Region. Past ENRTF appropriations totaling \$7.54 million helped acquire 1.076 acres.

The Metropolitan Regional Park System encompasses over 55,000 acres in 59 regional parks and 36 regional trails. These parks and trails hosted an estimated 45.8 million visits in 2012. The regional parks and trails are owned and managed by ten regional park implementing agencies of which five are negotiating with land owners for parcels that could be acquired under this proposal—Anoka County Parks, Dakota County Parks, Scott County Parks, Three Rivers Park District and Washington County Parks.

#### **II. PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOMES**

#### **Activity 1:** Award grants to acquire 374 acres

Grants financed with ENRTF funds will finance 45% of total acquisition costs. Metropolitan Council bonds and regional park agency funds will finance the remaining 55% to acquire some of the parcels on the 2015 Proposed Acquisition/Restoration List.

Criteria used to select these parcels are:

- 1. Parcel is within a regional park or trail master plan approved by the Metropolitan Council
- 2. Parcel contains high quality natural resources and has no habitable structures on it.
- 3. Regional park agency is currently in negotiations with the owner of these parcels.

The ENRTF funds will partially finance the purchase price of the parcel. Metropolitan Council bonds and regional park agency funds will finance the balance of purchase price plus transaction costs.

The acquisitions are in negotiation and therefore estimated costs for each parcel are confidential at this time. The total for all parcels is \$8.15 million. The Activity 1 table illustrates <u>examples</u> of the grants.

#### A. Project Team/Partners

The amount each agency receives is dependent on the amount needed for a particular grant and will be reported in future status reports in the Project Budget.

#### **B. Project Impact and Long-Term Strategy**

The Metropolitan Council's 2030 *Regional Parks Policy Plan* as amended in 2013 calls for acquiring 13,500 acres to meet the outdoor recreation needs of an expanding population in the seven-county Twin Cities Metropolitan Region. Past ENRTF appropriations totaling \$7.82 million helped acquire 1,076 acres.

A 2014 ENRTF pending appropriation of \$1.5 million matched with \$1.83 million of non-State funds will be used to acquire 200 acres of the 574 acres listed in the 2015 Proposed Acquisition/Restoration List. The estimated cost to purchase 200 acres is \$3.3 million. The estimated cost to purchase all parcels on the list is \$8.15 million. The proposed \$2.17 million of 2015 ENRTF funds matched with \$2.65 million of non-state funds is needed to acquire the remaining 374 acres.

Additional funding requests will be submitted to acquire and protect more high quality natural resource lands consistent with Metropolitan Council-approved regional park and trail master plans when those lands become available to purchase. Natural resource restoration activities are listed with estimated project and annual costs in each regional park and trail master plan. Other funding sources finance natural resource restoration activities including park agency funds and Parks and Trails Legacy funds.

#### **C. Timeline Requirements**

Timeline for this proposal is 3 years (July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2018) because regional park agencies cannot predict when acquisition negotiations will be completed and subsequently grants can be awarded.



NOTES: Three Rivers Park District parcel acquisitions will allow the Park District to restore a significant wetland along Rush Creek improving the water quality and overall health of Rush Creek as well as the Elm Creek and Mississippi River which it ultimately drains into. This project is still evolving and the actual acres, cost, acquisition method, etc. will be determined through negotiations with the property owner and City of Rogers.

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## Regional Parks and Trails Where High Quality Natural Resource Land Could be Acquired



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#### PROJECT MANAGER QUALIFICATIONS

Arne Stefferud is the manager of the Metropolitan Council's Regional Parks and Natural Resources program. He oversees the Metropolitan Council's Park Acquisition Opportunity Fund Grant program that is proposed to be partially funded with this proposal. He developed the grant program in 2001. The grants are awarded to regional park agencies to acquire land that is consistent with Metro Council approved master plans for each park and trail.

Since 1993, Mr. Stefferud has prepared LCCMR funding proposals, work programs and status reports plus overseen grant authorizations and payments of \$40.3 million of Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund appropriations for regional park and trail land acquisition and capital improvement grants.

#### **ORGANIZATION DESCRIPTION**

The Metropolitan Council is responsible for planning the orderly and economical growth of the seven county Twin Cities metropolitan region. The Regional Parks and Natural Resources program supports the Council to:

- 1. Create a Regional Parks Policy Plan that identifies the general location of lands for regional parks and trails which together with State parks and trails will reasonably meet the outdoor recreation needs of the region's residents and visitors.
- 2. Prepare a regional parks capital improvement program that prioritizes the expenditure of public funds on projects in Council approved regional park and trail master plans for the acquisition, rehabilitation and development of the Regional Park System. The Council also issues up to \$40 million of general obligation bonds for regional park and trail capital projects and uses those funds to match State funds for capital projects and land acquisition.
- 3. Authorize and administer about \$25 million annually of grants financed with State appropriations and Metro. Council bonds to implement the regional parks capital improvement program and \$8.5 million of State general funds to partially finance the operations and maintenance of the Regional Park System.
