#### PROJECT TITLE: Tower Historic Harbor Nature Trail/Kayak Route

#### I. PROJECT STATEMENT

This is a multi-faceted project that consists of the construction of a pedestrian (hiking/biking) trail, development of a kayaking route and the construction of a boat/canoe/kayak landing along the banks of the East Two Rivers located in Tower Minnesota. The trail will be constructed around the newly redeveloped Tower Historic Harbor, continue under the new Highway 169 bridge, pass by the new boat landing on an abandoned rail grade and connect to the existing Mesabi Trail. The segment around the historic harbor will have interpretative signage that that identifies the unique history of the harbor as it relates to the mining, logging and tourism industries. The segment of the trail that passes by the boat landing and connects to the Mesabi Trail will follow along the East Two Rivers and will include interpretative signage that identify unique characteristics of the area's geology, plants and wildlife. The trail will be built with a bituminous surface, in the most environmentally sensitive manner, to provide access to nature enthusiasts of all ages. The users will be able to enjoy the variety of wetlands and bogs, unique geological features and wildlife that will include otters, muskrats, eagles, ospreys and wide assortment of other wildlife.

The kayak route will be mapped along the East Two Rivers, West Two Rivers and portions of Lake Vermilion. Interpretative signage will be incorporated along the shores of this route to highlight the large variety of the unique environmental characteristics of the river, lakes and shoreline.

The boat landing, parking areas and access road will be constructed in cooperation with MN DNR and will built to accommodate the users of the trail and kayak route. Construction will be completed in the most environmentally sensitive manner to avoid impacts on the pristine natural resources of this area.

The total estimated cost for this project is estimated to be \$1,440,000. Tower is requesting \$1,430,000 from the LCCMR to complete this work.

The City of Tower is developing the land around the harbor in order try to keep commercial development off of Lake Vermilion and in areas of the city where public infrastructure is available. The City has invested over \$800,000 into this project to date and has received over \$5,000,000 in local, state and federal dollars to reroute portions of State Highway 135, construct a new bridge on State Highway 169 and to dredge portions of the harbor and East Two Rivers. The city has a signed development agreement with a developer to construct a 36 unit hotel along the harbor at a cost of approximately \$4,000,000. The City of Tower also has applications pending with the IRRRB and DEED to further extend infrastructure in the harbor area.


