I. PROJECT STATEMENT

Our goal is to secure a majestic thirty acre former resort site on the shores of Crane Lake at the entrance to Voyageurs National Park in order for the Town to work in partnership with an adjacent DNR 7 acre site to build a comprehensive entrance point to the Park that will include a Department of Interior Visitors Center, boat ramp, docks, beach, campground, restrooms, and educational and community space. This site is the last of four Visitors Centers planned for the Park forty years ago.

Voyageurs National Park is Minnesota's only national park and the nation's only water-based national park, consisting of more than 84,000 acres of water and 134, acres of land. The interconnected waterways of the park provide an unparalleled opportunity for citizens to explore the Northwoods lake and border country. You must leave your car and take to the water to fully explore and experience the lakes, islands, and shorelines of the park. Nearly 200 years ago, voyageurs paddled birch bark canoes full of animal pelts and trade goods through the park on their way to Canada. Today, people explore the park by canoes, kayaks, houseboats, and motorboats.

Water is the defining feature of Voyageurs National Park. Access and tourism expansion was the long-term promise of the park—increasing economic opportunities for local residents while preserving a national treasure and developing recreational and educational opportunities for our citizens.

This request for \$950,000 is to purchase the former Borderland Resort site on the shores of Crane Lake. The overall goal is to create a Visitor Center operated by the Department of Interior and coordinated with the DNR's new boat ramp and entrance point while combining all with a new campground and public space. The purchase of this key property is a one-time opportunity to fully develop the final entrance point of the original four entrance points to the park.

II. PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOMES

The main effort is to purchase and secure the prime piece of property that is essential to create and build a national caliber visitors center, campground, boat ramp, docks, beach, restrooms, and educational and community space in cooperation with the Department of the Interior, the VNP, the DNR, and the Town of Crane Lake.

The total budget for the project is \$950,000, our best estimate subject to appraisal of the property.

The total activity directly related to this request is to secure this prime property to ensure the available space for a comprehensive visitor center and entrance to VNP. The purchase plan developed from a comprehensive community planning effort including consultations with the DNR and VNP and approved by the Town Board. The Town of Crane Lake will hold title to this 30 acre section of land with 300' of shoreline on Crane Lake. The measurable outcome will be the purchase of the property and the completion of the master plan for the Center.

III. PROJECT STRATEGY

A. Project Team/Partners

The project team includes a committee of the Town of Crane Lake that will negotiate, appraise, and purchase the property. The Town of Crane Lake Board will receive the money, and if granted, will execute the purchase. Partners in the process to develop the comprehensive site include Bill Carlson, Acting Superintendent of the VNP, Scott Kelling representing the DNR in the development of their nearly adjacent site, and Jim Janssen, Chair of the Town Board of Crane Lake. We are working through the offices of Congressman Nolan and US Senators Franken and Klobuchar to coordinate our efforts with the General Services Administration and the US Department of Interior and Crystal Franklin, NPS Facilities.

B. Project Impact and Long-Term Strategy

The long-term strategy is to complete a comprehensive Visitor Center for Crane Lake at the entrance to Voyageurs National Park to complement the other three centers at Rainy Lake, Kabetogama, and Ash River. The model is the recently completed Visitors Center at Rainy Lake in International Falls, where the General Services Administration on behalf of the VNP leases a facility over thirty years that was built by the City of International Falls to Park Service specifications. In addition, the site identified is nearly adjacent to a new boat ramp, restroom facilities, and small campground being developed by the DNR in cooperation with the park which will be expanded as a result of this initiative to complete a comprehensive visitors center and recreational site for the region. The sustainability of the project is the long-term lease and commitment by the VNP to operate a park presence in the Crane Lake area in cooperation with the DNR development nearby. Other funds will be sought, including funding from the Township, the State perhaps through bonding, USDA Rural Services, and the USFS.

C. Timeline Requirements

The timeline of the project is to complete the appraisal mid-2017 and the purchase by October 31, 2017.
