## Process for M.L. 2022


For the FY 2022 and FY 2023 biennium (July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023), approximately \$70 million is available each year for funding from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund. As of April 2, 2021, the Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCCMR) received 220 proposals requesting a total of approximately \$178 million. This RFP process is for funding beginning July 1, 2022.

LCCMR reviews and evaluates all proposals against their 10 adopted evaluation criteria. On June 16-17, members will select a subset of high-ranking proposals to invite for presentation before the LCCMR on July 6-8 and 13-15 in order to receive further consideration. On July 28-29, LCCMR will make final selection and funding allocation decisions. These selected projects will be presented to the 2022 Minnesota Legislature as the official LCCMR recommendations for spending from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund.






