Process for M.L. 2023


For the FY 2024 and FY 2025 biennium (July 1, 2023 -June 30, 2025), approximately \$79 million is available each year for funding from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund and approximately \$189,000 is available from the Great Lakes Protection Account. As of May 26, 2021, the Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCCMR) received 174 proposals requesting a total of approximately \$164 million. This RFP process is for funding beginning July 1, 2023.

The LCCMR reviews and evaluates all proposals against their 10 adopted evaluation criteria. On July 25, members selected 85 proposals requesting a total of approximately \$86 million to invite for a presentation before the LCCMR on August 8, 9, 10, 16, and 17 in order to receive further consideration. On August 30, the LCCMR will meet to make final selection and funding allocation decisions. These selected projects will be presented to the 2023 Minnesota Legislature as the official LCCMR recommendations for spending from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund and Great Lakes Protection Account.






