Otter and Campbell Lakes within the City of Hutchinson are crucial water bodies that provide an important recreational opportunity to residents and visitors. The proximity of the lakes to the Luce Line State Trail and the South Fork of the Crow River, a State Water Trail, highlights the importance and popularity of these lakes for fishing and boating. Otter Lake is surrounded by multiple public parks and campgrounds. Currently, these public spaces lack safe and accessible fishing piers, parking areas, boat access, and walk-in access for canoes and kayaks. The lack of these areas presents an accessibility concern, limiting the usage of these lakes for the public, including underserved communities in MPCA-identified Environmental Justice Areas of Concern (EJAC). EJAC are defined as areas where at least 40% of the population are living 185% below the federal poverty level.

The City of Hutchinson is proposing to address these problems by:

- Providing pedestrian safety improvements
- Providing ADA accessible fishing piers and walk-in boat access points
- Providing safe parking areas

These additions will improve accessibility and recreational opportunities as well as better integrate the public parks surrounding Otter and Campbell Lakes. The improvements will also provide greater access and consideration for EJAC communities. This project will be completed entirely on land currently owned by the City of Hutchinson.

What are the specific project outcomes as they relate to the public purpose of protection, conservation, preservation, and enhancement of the state's natural resources?

This project will enhance the state natural resource known as "Otter Lake" and "Campbell Lake" within the City of Hutchinson. These regionally important lakes provide crucial fish and wildlife habitat as well as recreational opportunities. This project will preserve and enhance the lake for future generations by improving access to shore fishing, canoeing, kayaking, and boating for local residents and visitors, including those residents in MPCA Environmental Justice Areas of Concern.

Activities and Milestones

Activity 1: Final design, engineering, and environmental permitting for the Otter Lake Improvements.

Activity Budget: \$200,000

Activity Description:

Final design and engineering includes all necessary design work to develop construction plans for fishing pier and boat access installation, as well as parking lot and ADA improvements. Permits that will be required for this project will include MNDNR public waters, MNWCA, US Army Corps of Engineers 404 and MPCA NPDES. The engineer will complete all bid specifications for public RFP process.

Activity 2: Construction of walk-in access points, boat launches, boulder removal, and parking lot and installation of fishing piers on Otter Lake.

Activity Budget: \$1,200,000

Activity Description:

This activity includes construction materials and construction services for fishing pier installation, walk-in access points, boat launches, boulder removal for kayak/canoe accessibility, and the parking lot on Otter Lake.

Long-Term Implementation and Funding

The Otter and Campbell Lakes Accessible Recreation Opportunities Project is a long-term project with multiple phases that will be completed over the next few years. The City has already completed an EAW and received \$3.1 million in State bonding funds that will fund restoration efforts. Future phases of the project include: shoreline restoration, deepening of Campbell Lake and the northern portion of Otter Lake, the installation of fish habitat in Otter and Campbell Lakes. Funding for the larger project will come from eligible grants received, State and Federal allocations, and from the City of Hutchinson.
