**Project Summary:** Loppet and community collaborators will promote urban nature connection for North Minneapolis residents through storytelling, nature and environmental justice programming, and environmental leadership pathways for high schoolers and young adults.

#### **Narrative**

#### Describe the opportunity or problem your proposal seeks to address. Include any relevant background information.

Based on visionary and historic land preservation, Theodore Wirth Park (TWP) was set aside in the early 1900's along with corridors of urban green space connecting lakes, woodlands, and creeks with the Mississippi River. This has placed Minneapolis as a consistently top-rated urban center in terms of green space, with TWP rivaling NYC's Central Park in size. However, the vision of a city united by green space was left incomplete and checkered by a history of racism and systemic injustice. It is now widely recognized that Minneapolis parks were central to restricted convenances and red-lining practices that discouraged low-income populations and people of color access to green space.

Through scoping for this project, partners representing communities of color in North Minneapolis neighborhoods abutting TWP spoke consistently of a very real divide between white and black, and rich and poor along Plymouth Avenue which connects TWP to North Minneapolis. And yet these same partners also told stories of resilience and connection to nature and TWP centered around a network of families and community groups that have been working towards equal opportunities for nature connection among their neighborhoods and youth.

Through a history of quality outdoor programing and the realization of the Trailhead outdoor center, Loppet plays a central role in connecting people with TWP. But current Loppet offerings are based around culture and activities familiar to white and more affluent residents. In this proposal, we prioritize partnerships to tell stories of what TWP means for BIPOC neighbors, we implement nature and environmental educational initiatives that bridge the Plymouth Avenue divide, and we build a pathway for future leaders in nature connectedness and environmental justice.

# What are the specific project outcomes as they relate to the public purpose of protection, conservation, preservation, and enhancement of the state's natural resources?

Permanent indoor/outdoor signage, interpretive exhibits, and art installations throughout North Minneapolis parks tell stories of what green space and environmental stewardship means to residents.

7 exhibitions throughout North Minneapolis feature these multi-media stories for over 1200 primary and 18,000 secondary participants.

Engage 56+ North Minneapolis community groups in depth 4-8 session outdoor urban educational programs featuring stories of place, mindfulness, embodied practice, and environmental justice for 1150 participants.

Northside Pathways program will develop a cohort of 20-30 future high school and young adult environmental leaders. 60+ contractors, artists, and student leaders from Minneapolis' Northside employed in delivering project.

# **Activities and Milestones**

### Activity 1: Telling Stories of BIPOC Nature Connection to Theodore Wirth Park

Activity Budget: \$272,000

#### **Activity Description:**

Current histories of TWP and outdoor activities prioritized within Loppet Foundation focus on values of white middle to upper class residents. With partners, we are in the process of gathering stories of connection to nature and TWP from voices within communities of color and lower income residents through interviews, focus groups, and community research. In this proposed activity, we will tell these stories of challenge, opportunity, and justice through the following. An interpretive traveling exhibit that includes 30 pieces of art that models, illustrates, or augment stories produced by North Minneapolis artisans. The exhibit will also include three audio/video displays of a multi-media mini-documentary series summarizing project stories and curricular elements. The whole exhibit will cohere to illustrate overarching stories and themes. This indoor exhibit will be housed in Theodore Wirth Park at the Trailhead Adventure Center and will travel for special events and programs to other North Minneapolis community centers. This indoor exhibit will be complemented by outdoor displays in Wirth Park and other North Minneapolis green spaces, and along Plymouth Avenue in North Minneapolis.

# Activity 2: Connecting North Minneapolis Youth to Green Space and Theodore Wirth Park

Activity Budget: \$244,700

#### **Activity Description:**

Through listening to partners and their stories, Loppet is currently developing a 21st century environmental education curriculum based on the values of north Minneapolis residents to foster a sense of belonging, nature connectedness, and environmental stewardship. In this project activity, we will work with partners to implement this curriculum in TWP, in other North Minneapolis green spaces, and in civic hubs including schools and community centers. We will implement a combination of programs, indoor/outdoor interpretive exhibits, and community events that feature stories, storytellers, interpretive media, and art contributed by North Minneapolis residents. These programs will be delivered by Loppet staff and pathways leaders (see Activity 3) and offered on a year-round basis with additional capacity during the summer season with green spaces are most heavily utilized. Programs will be delivered in partnership with other community organizations. Each programs will be offered as both four and eight-module series to build depth of connection and commitment.

# Activity 3: 3. Developing a Pathway of Future Environmental Leaders from the N. Minneapolis Community

Activity Budget: \$271,300

#### **Activity Description:**

The activities above build on 15 years of Loppet youth programs in North Minneapolis public elementary and middle schools. We will partner with neighborhood high schools, community centers, and University of Minnesota to start an outdoor adventure and environmental leadership club for high school and college students, and young adults. The goal will be to deepen nature connection and build paid opportunities for the next generation of leaders to add their stories and experience to the legacy of Minneapolis parks. We will offer 12 paid semester-long positions for undergraduate and graduate students to participate as pathways leaders working with Loppet staff and partners to implement the activities outlined in this grant. We will also offer 8 positions for summer camp counsellors for high school students. All of these positions will be hired prioritizing demographic backgrounds and residence representing the North Minneapolis community. These leaders will also participate in an help lead a weekly outdoor pathways program designed to connect high school age youth and young adults from Minneapolis' Northside with opportunities for nature connection, mindfulness, embodied practice, and environmental justice.

This grant is part of an ongoing project with multiple sources of funding. North Minneapolis partners are gathering stories through interviews, focus groups, and community research. Prior to the activities outlined in this grant application, this data will be archived and analyzed, and key themes and illustrative stories will be presented to partners for feedback and incorporated into existing curricula. The activities in this grant will provide permanent interpretive resources, grow public interest, and help usher programs and leadership opportunities through development stages. We will seek funding for term personnel hired through this grant to continue over time.

Adventures Director DeAnna Perkins is a Minneapolis community member who believes deeply in the power of service as the foundation to build community and connect others to opportunities. She brings a breadth of knowledge and experience in youth development, team management, project facilitation, and community organizing. DeAnna's professional experience including leadership and community engagement work for Minneapolis Public Schools, City of Minneapolis, and Northside Redevelopment Council. Previous to directing Loppet Adventures, DeAnna held the position of Executive Director at the Harold Mezile North Community YMCA which serves the residents of North Minneapolis.

DeAnna grew up in Minneapolis and graduated from Minneapolis North High School. She remembers her experiences as a youth outdoors at Theodore Wirth Park, including her first golf camp and bike trail. She is passionate about creating opportunities for North Minneapolis youth like she had as a child and has remained deeply rooted in the North Minneapolis community. DeAnna holds a Business degree from Bradley University, Peoria, IL.

#### **Organization Description:**

The Loppet Foundation's mission is to connect people to the outdoors through experiences that grow community. Our goals are to 1) build community around the outdoors; 2) partner with underrepresented communities and organizations to increase access to the outdoors; 3) host high-quality outdoor events that engage people of all backgrounds, ages and abilities; 4) create a public space promoting year-round outdoor recreation and wellness.

In Loppet's 20 years, we've grown to engage 20,000 people annually in outdoor activities including trail running, cross country skiing, mountain biking, and paddling. Loppet operates out of "The Trailhead", a 14,000 square foot facility that serves as a hub for outdoor activity and is surrounded by expanded trails and outdoor infrastructure.

Loppet Adventures currently partners with 20 public schools in North Minneapolis to run free programs that engage 1500 youth in year-round outdoor activities from cross country skiing and mountain biking to mindfulness and nature connection. Adventures programs are designed for outcomes of belonging, experience, healing, and empowerment.
